Capacity and Safety issues relating to the trunk road network threaten to constrain development.

The dominance of car modal share for tourists travel, for reasons including the perceived limitations of public transport, results in significant problems for the trunk road network particularly the A30.

The emerging policy framework in Cornwall should ensure that new development does not increase the demand for unsustainable transport.

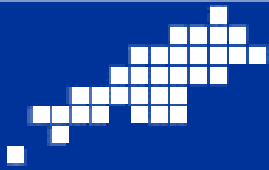
